Kuwait University is the State of Kuwait's national university, leading in both higher education and scientific research. It was established in 1966 as the state's first public institution of higher education and research.


College of Architecture



Abstract Guidelines for Papers

- Length of the title should not exceed 12 words
- Briefly describe the work to be discussed in your paper and give a concise summary of expected findings
- Abstract should not include diagrams
- Abstract should not include references
- Abstract should be MS (Times News Roman) word, font 14, with limit of 350 words.

Conference Proceedings Book & Publication

All accepted papers will be published in the conference proceeding of ICMA 2022 either in abstract or full paper format. The proceeding will be jointly edited by both Abdullatif Alfozan Award for Mosque Architecture and Kuwait University and will be printed before the conference by Kuwait University Press in a volume with ISBN code, with SCOPUS indexing. In addition, the proceedings book will be available in both hardcopy and softcopy versions that will be among the Abdullatif Al Fozan Award for Mosque Architecture (AFAMA) publications.

At a later stage after the full submission of all papers, fifteen of the distinguished papers will be selected by the Journal of Engineering Research (JER) to be published in a special issue of the JER, which may require additional revisions.
